## 💥 Scholarship for 3rd-year junior high school students, no repayment required. 🎇

The city aims to encourage dreams by providing new scholarships to prospective high school students who have good academic records and need financial assistance to support their studies.

#### New Scholarship Program for 3rd-year Junior High School Students

**Scholarship Amount:** 70,000 yen as a lump-sum payment upon entering high school **Eligibility:** 3rd-year junior high school students whose parents registered residents in the city and will enter high school in April 2025

Capacity: 20 students (selected by the scholarship selection committee)

Application Period: November 1 (Friday) - December 16 (Monday)

The scholarships do not need to be repaid.

※ Application details will be posted on the city website around October.

♦ Selection Guideline

Selection is based on their academic achievement, household income, number of absences, and other factors.

#### **OHousehold Income**

Eligibility will be determined based on the total income of all family members in 2023,

considering the age composition of the family and any special circumstances.

Number of People in the Household (Assumed Household Composition)	Amount of income
2 people (single parent, student	3,760,000 yen or below
3 people (parents、student)	4,310,000 yen or below
4 people (parents, student themself, a high school sibbling)	5,200,000 yen or below

※ The amount of income above is just an estimated amount.

#### **OAcademic Achievement**

The average evaluation of the most recent grades must be 3.1 or higher.

#### **ODays Absent**

The total number of days absent from the first day of junior high school until the end of October in the 3rd year should be 20 days or less.

\*Absences due to unavoidable circumstances will be considered.

The Scholarship Selection Committee will select the recipients. Results will be posted in mid-February 2025, and the scholarship will be provided in March.

\*Single person who does not meet the above conditions may only apply for those units which haven't been applied for, for at least 4 months.

\*If there are too many applicants, a public lottery will be held.

\*If you are applying for the first time, please visit the Housing Policy Division on the 6th floor of the city hall before the application period.

\*Units that have not been selected in the current round of applications will automatically be available. \*You can apply without a guarantor.

# 💥 Natural Disaster Preparedness 💥

The fourth installment of our series on disaster preparedness will focus on preparing and storing materials in case of natural disasters. When a natural disaster occurs, it is predicted that the essential service and the flow of materials will be disrupted. Therefore, it is crucial that each household stock necessary materials.

The fourth installment: Stock products that are useful!

Even small changes in your daily routine can adequately prepare you for natural disasters.

■Emergency food : "Rolling stock" is the best!

"Rolling stock" involves buying a slightly larger amount of usual daily products and constantly replenishing the stock as you use them. The method ensures that your household always has a sufficient amount of

portable toilets to protect your family's health! In the event of natural disasters, toilets may not be usable due to damage or water outage. This can lead to unhealthy conditions such as dehydration, constipation, or economy class syndrome. It is important to have enough portable toilets to prevent these situations.


There are various types of portable toilets on the market, including those that cover the toilet seat, or transportable ones. It is recommended to have portable toilets to use five times a day per person. Additionally, it is advised to stock up on toilet paper, large plastic bags, wet wipes, and sanitizers.
